Gurajada Apparao Birth Anniversary

Gurajada Apparao was a Telugu poet, playwright, and social reformer who lived in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. He is widely regarded as the father of modern Telugu literature and one of the pioneers of Indian nationalism. He used his literary skills to expose the social evils and injustices prevalent in his time and to advocate for the rights and dignity of the oppressed classes.

One of his most famous works is Kanyasulkam, a play that deals with the issue of bride price, child marriage, and widow remarriage. The play was first staged in 1892 and caused a sensation among the audience and the critics.

The Birth Anniversary of the great Telugu poet Gurajada Apparao was celebrated on 21st September every year. On this occasion, the Department of Telugu, under the headship of Sri.D.Raju conducted “TELUGU POEM SINGING COMPETITION” related to the poems of the great poet.

National Unity Day

National Unity Day is celebrated every year on 31st October to commemorate the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. It is also known as Rashtriya Ekta Diwas. The reason behind the celebration of this day is to make people aware of the ideas of staying together and uplifting society. It was celebrated for the first time in 2014.

Several events are organized on this day like 'Run For Unity', a nationwide marathon to increase awareness about the contribution of Sardar Patel to national integrity, National Unity pledge, etc. In 2018, the Government of India unveiled the 'Statue of Unity' in Gujarat to mark the 143rd birth anniversary of Sardar Patel.

The Statue of Unity is the tallest statue in the world. At 182 meters, it is 23 meters taller than China's Spring Temple Buddha statue and almost double the height of the Statue of Liberty (93 meters tall) in the US. In January 2020, it was added to the 'Eight Wonders' of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO).

Republic Day Celebrations

Republic Day is one of three Indian national holidays and it commemorates the enactment of the constitution of India, which occurred on January 26, 1950.

After the declaration of India's independence, a constituent assembly elected by provincial assemblies went about drafting a constitution that would govern the newly independent nation. It took more than two years for the completion of constitution of India and the establishment of India's independent democratic government.

January 26 was chosen as the official enactment date as a nod to the Purna Swaraj (complete self-rule) declaration of independence by the Indian National Congress in 1930 — considered the first concrete step toward independence from Britain.

With the 1950 constitution, the country was officially known as the Republic of India — a “sovereign socialist secular democratic republic” that “secures all its citizens justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity,” according to its preamble.

Sankranti also called 'Makar Sankranti' is a festival celebrating the beginning of the harvesting season in India. It is celebrated almost all over the country, especially in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, and Maharashtra. In Andhra Pradesh, the Makara Sankranti is celebrated for three days. During this time, the cultural supremacy of the state comes to the forefront as every place in Andhra Pradesh reflects the festive spirit.

Why is Makar Sankranti Celebrated

Makar Sankranti kite festival is dedicated to Lord Sun. This day is also referred to as a specific solar day as per the Hindu Calendar. On this day, the sun enters Capricorn, the zodiac sign, also called Makar. This marks the end of winter season and the beginning of longer days. This is also the start of Magh month. To compensate for the difference that occurs due to the revolution around the sun, every 80 years the day of Sankranti is delayed by one day.

From this auspicious day, the sun commences its northward journey or Uttarayan journey. Thus, Makar Sankranti is also called Uttarayan. To celebrate, farmers in India wish for a good harvest.

How is Makar Sankranti Celebrated

The typical celebration of the 'Makar Sankranti' takes place for three days. All houses are decorated. Guests and in laws are invited and sweets are given out to all. People dress themselves up as characters from mythology. The first day, that is Bhogi Panduga, people burn all the old articles. The second day, Pedda Panduga is the Sankranti day when the big festival is held. People are dressed in new clothes and pray to God. There are also feasts arranged for the guests. Cock fighting was a favorite game during the Makar Sankranti, but it is now banned in Andhra Pradesh. The third day, the Kanuma Panduga is the day for having meat after excessive sweets.

On the occasion of this festival, people start their day early. On this day, people clean their homes wholly and wear new clothes for the festival. People throw their useless articles into fire, known as Bhogi Mantalu, which is made up of cow-dung cakes and woods.

Female members of the society dance and sing around the fire to praise the Lord Indra. The main reason of the bonfire is to make the weather warm to the last time of the winter season. For some people, this is a time to stay with their family and for some this is a reunion. People spend the day with their near and dear ones.

People also do domestic activities such as like cleaning their homes. Bhogi day is therefore also meant for Domestic Activities. The major attraction of this festival is the Buffalo fights. In Andhra Pradesh, Bhogi festival is celebrated with great enthusiasm. Mainly girls celebrate the day by wearing new clothes and burning their old clothes.

The reason behind the celebration of Bhogi festival is to please Lord Indra, i.e., the God of Clouds and Rains. With the help of Lord Indra's blessings, abundance of harvest can be possible which brings prosperity to the land. Hence, Bhogi festival day is sometimes also termed as Indran.

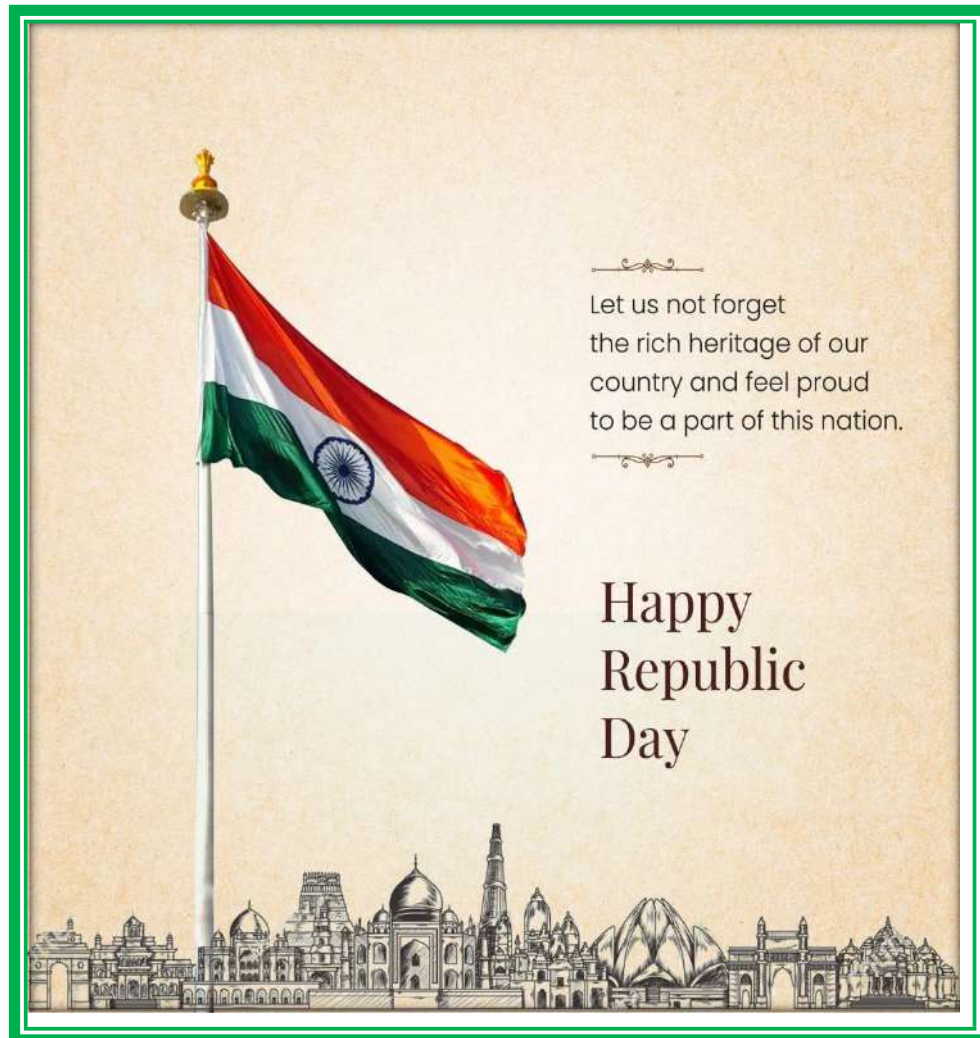

Republic Day

Republic Day is the day when India marks and celebrates the date on which the Constitution of India came into effect on 26 January 1950. This replaced the Government of India Act 1935 as the governing document of India, thus turning the nation into a republic separate from British Raj. The constitution was adopted by the Indian Constituent Assembly on 26 November 1949 and came into effect on 26 January 1950. 26 January was chosen as the date for Republic Day as it was on that day in 1930 when the Declaration of Indian Independence was proclaimed by the Indian National Congress.

History :

India achieved independence from the British Raj on 15 August 1947 following the Indian independence movement. The independence came through the Indian Independence Act 1947 (10 & 11 Geo 6 c 30), an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom that partitioned British India into the two new independent Dominions of the British Commonwealth (later Commonwealth of Nations).^[2] India obtained its independence on 15 August 1947 as a constitutional monarchy with George VI as head of state and the Earl Mountbatten as governor-general. The country, though, did not yet have a permanent constitution; instead its laws were based on the modified colonial Government of India Act 1935. On 29 August 1947, a resolution was moved for the appointment of Drafting Committee, which was appointed to draft a permanent constitution, with Dr B R Ambedkar as chairman. While India's Independence Day celebrates its freedom from British Rule, the Republic Day celebrates the coming into force of its constitution. A draft constitution was prepared by the committee and submitted to the Constituent Assembly on 4 November 1947.^[3] The Assembly met for

166 days in public sessions spanning two years, 11 months, and 17 days before adopting the Constitution. The 308 members of the Assembly signed two handwritten copies of the document (one in Hindi and one in English) on 24 January 1950, after much deliberation and some changes.^[4] Two days later which was on 26 January 1950, it came into effect throughout the whole nation. On that day, Dr. Rajendra Prasad's began his first term of office as President of the Indian Union. The Constituent Assembly became the Parliament of India under the transitional provisions of the new Constitution.^[5] On the eve of Republic Day, the President addresses the nation.

On November 25, 1949, in his final speech to the Constituent Assembly, Dr B R Ambedkar remarked about the potential and pitfalls of life after January 26, 1950

On the 26th of January 1950, we are going to enter into a life of contradictions. In politics we will have equality and in social and economic life we will have inequality. In politics we will be recognising the principle of one man one vote and one vote one value. In our social and economic life, we shall, by reason of our social and economic structure, continue to deny the principle of one man one value. How long shall we continue to live this life of contradictions? How long shall we continue to deny equality in our social and economic life? If we continue to deny it for long, we will do so only by putting our political democracy in peril. We must remove this contradiction at the earliest possible moment or else those who suffer from inequality will blow up the structure of political democracy which this Assembly has so laboriously built up

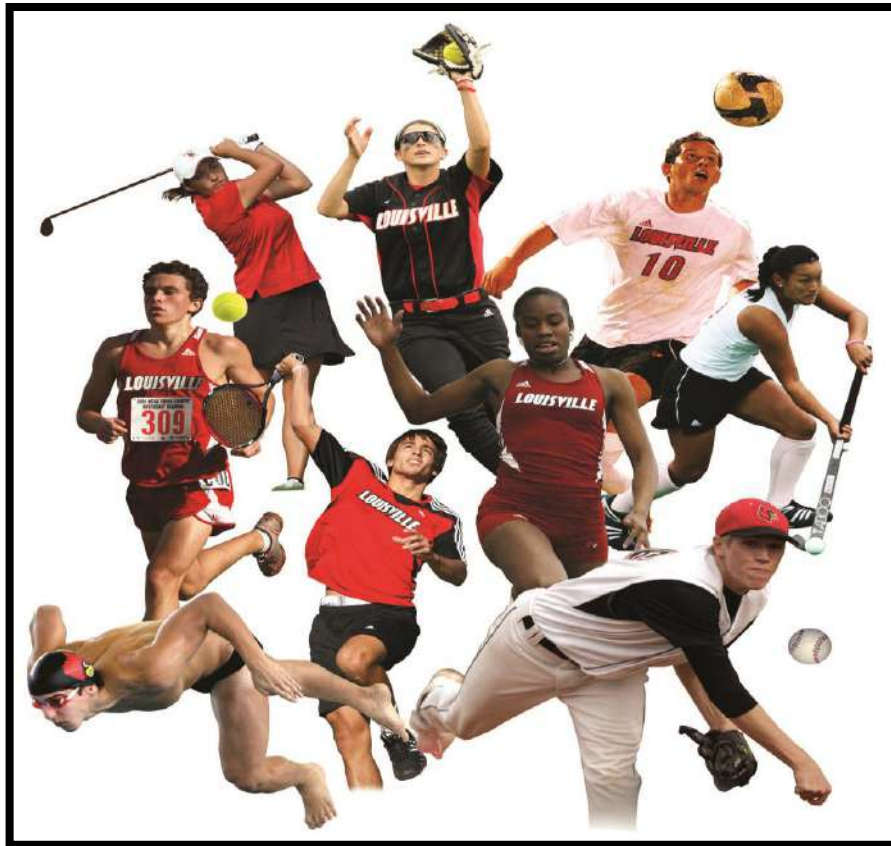

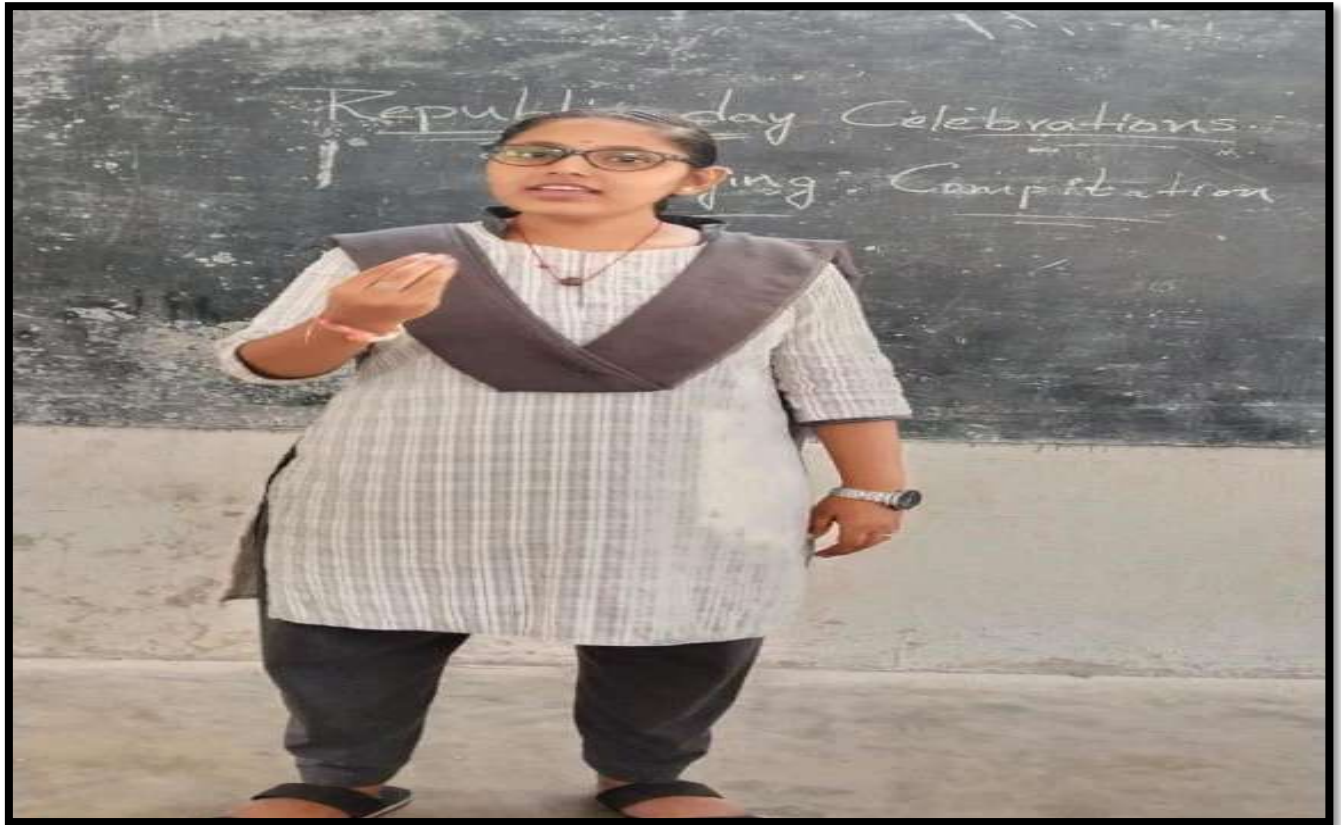

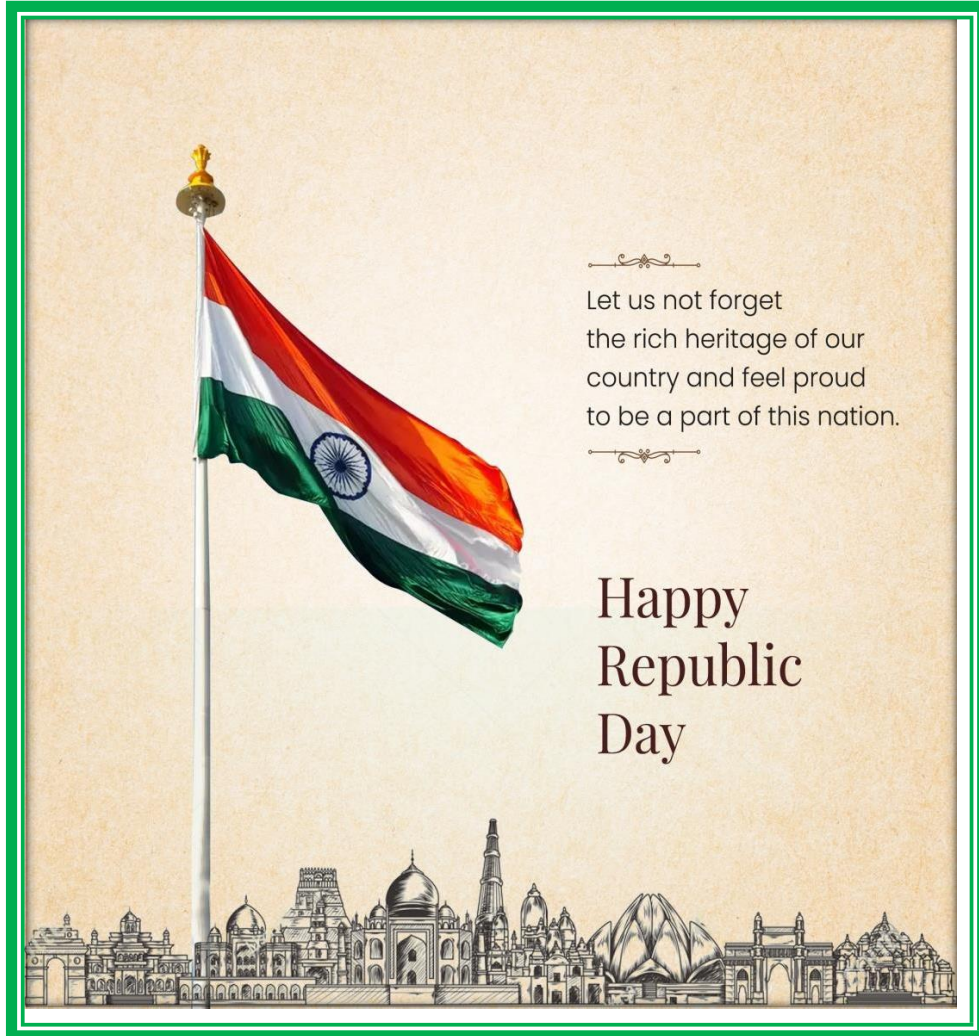
